\* Great marble cakes are made by alternating pink, chocolate and white cake mix on top of each other and around the tin.

\* Use dark coloured cocoa for chocolate cakes and chocolate crackles. Try to match the colour of your chocolate icing to the colour of your chocolate cake.

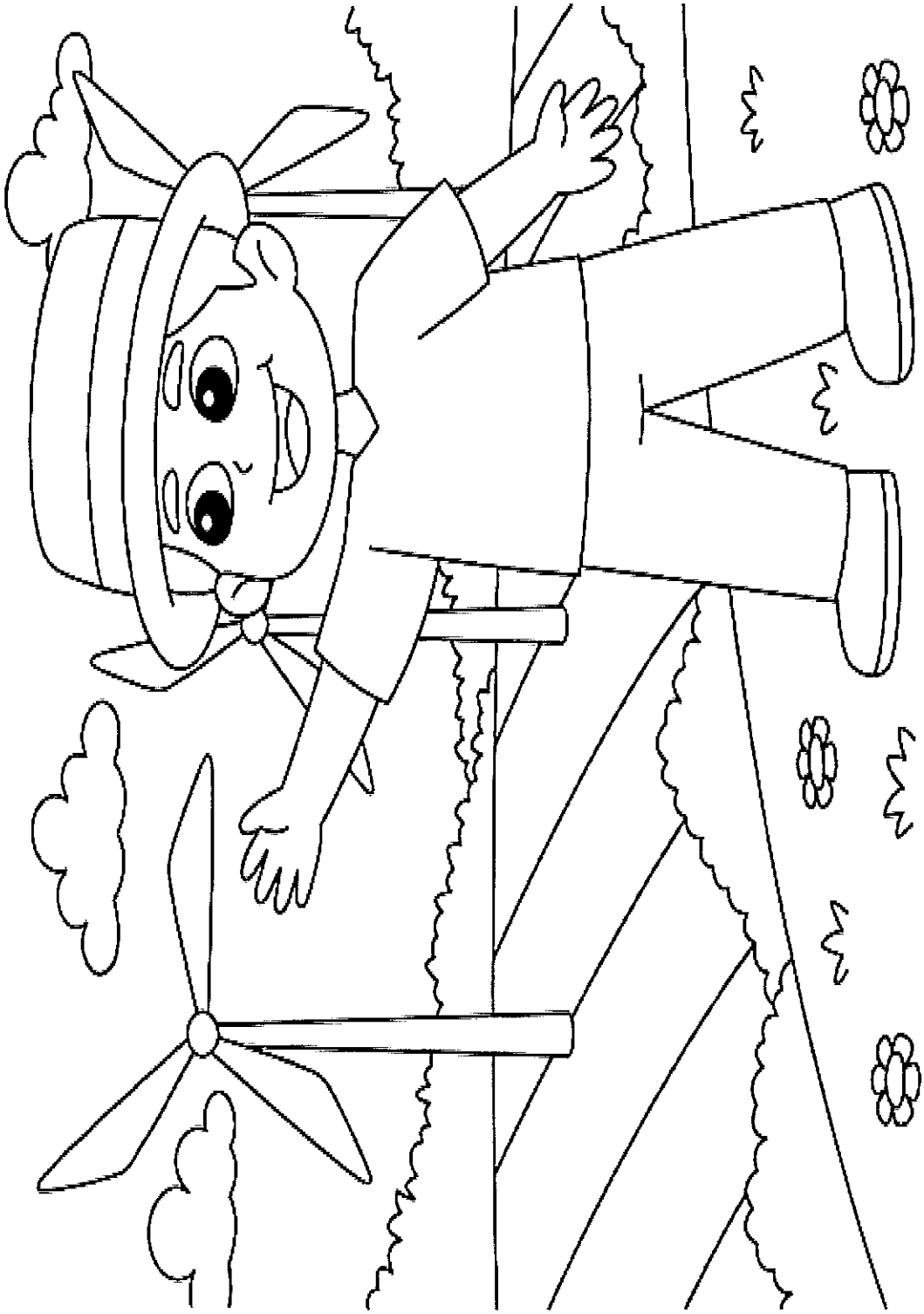

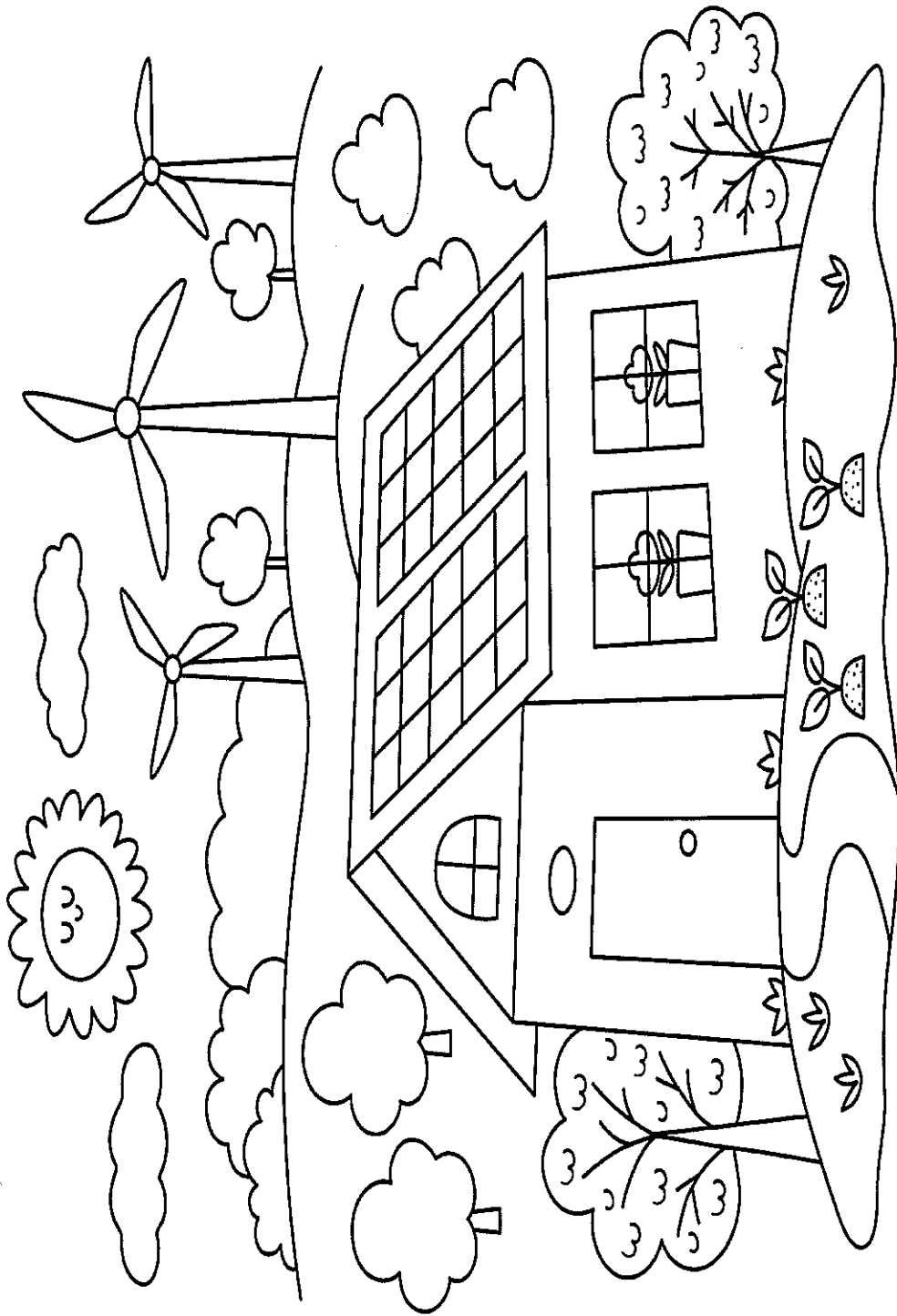
